How do I leave a gift in my will?

Step 1. Decide on your gift

We recommend consulting your solicitor or seeking advice when writing a will

You can choose to leave:

- a percentage of your estate, for example 10%.
- a specific amount, for example \$10,000.00
- a particular asset, for example property, shares or valuables
- the residue of your estate that remains after other gifts and expenses are paid

Step 2. Use the correct wording

When leaving a gift in your will, it is important to use the right wording to ensure the success of your gift. Below is an example of a clause that you may wish to use:

"I give to The Cats Protection League Wellington Incorporated (Charity Services Number CC10864) (state what you wish to give), to be used for its general purposes. Acknowledgement from an authorised officer of The Cats Protection League Wellington Inc. will be sufficient to show that my executors have fulfilled their duty."
